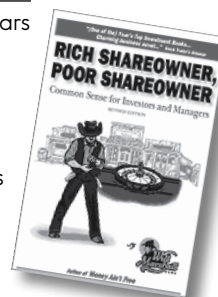
ODDS-ON Investing™
