So, You Want to be a Millionaire (Teen Edition)

Every teen should take this course before graduating from high school. Teens know how to buy consumer products; this course teaches them how to buy their economic freedom.

Created for high school seniors and juniors, this 2½ hour interactive seminar helps participants learn how the TEEN FACTOR™ can make a 15-year-old become a millionaire for only \$3.36/day. Using a technique that Einstein called “the most powerful force in the universe,” this seminar teaches the three things that virtually any teen can do to ensure that s/he becomes a millionaire. When teens leave the seminar, they will have a basic roadmap that they can discuss with their parents to become millionaires.

The workshop is open to high school students who are AT LEAST 15 years of age. High school teachers are encouraged to register their entire class (Consumer Education and related classes can really benefit). We will limit the enrollment to approximately 30 students per session and will accept reservations on a first-come, first-served basis.

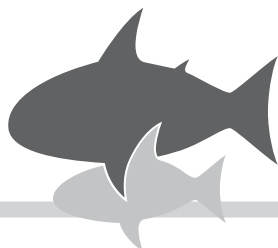
