

# 2021 ICCB Economic Impact Study<sup>9</sup>

More than 80% of completers of long-term certificate programs or AAS programs at Parkland College are employed in career jobs within a year of graduation.

Career job employment rates for long-term certificate and AAS completers within 1 Year, by career cluster:

- Health Science: 89%
- Business, Management, & Admin: 84%
- Manufacturing: 82%
- Information Technology: 82%
- Human Services: 80%
- Agriculture, Food & Natural Resources: 76%

Median annual earnings of long-term certificate & AAS completers 3 years after graduating<sup>10</sup>: **\$39,63** 

A Parkland graduate can expect a lifetime earnings *gain* over a 40-year career of \$620,000.




